BIOGRAPHICAL NOTES

CANDIDATES ADMITTED TO DOCTORAL DEGREES

BEDE PETER XAVIER HARRIS

Admitted to the Degree of Doctor of Philosophy

Bede Harris was born in Harare, Zimbabwe. After graduation with a BA (Mod) degree from Trinity College, Dublin, he took an LLB degree *cum laude* at Rhodes University, South Africa, and then lectured at the Law School of the University of Natal, Pietermaritzburg. He and his wife, Veronica, came to New Zealand in 1992, and Bede joined the staff of the School of Law, where he is now Senior Lecturer. His DPhil thesis, written under the supervision of Professor Margaret Wilson, foundation Dean of the School of Law, is entitled *Freedom of Expression and Human Dignity*. The thesis argues that the values of truth-seeking and individual self-fulfilment are fundamental to freedom of expression and addresses the question of how to set limits on freedom of expression that compromise these values to the least possible extent. The thesis surveys case law on freedom of expression arising under the First Amendment in the United States and under the Canadian Charter of Rights and Freedoms, and rejects contemporary arguments which characterise the inspiration of discriminatory attitudes as a sufficient reason for limiting freedom of expression, as under this approach freedom of expression is limited essentially because of the ideas it presents. Instead Bede argues that the concept of dignity, which was an actionable right in Roman Law, and remains so in the Roman-Dutch law of South Africa and some continental legal systems, provides a suitable criterion for limiting freedom of expression. He proposes that freedom of expression should be limited only where it causes harm in the form of insults taking the form of meaningless abuse, where it takes the form of defamatory statements of fact which the plaintiff can prove to be false, or where the expression incites those exposed to unlawful conduct.

DAVID VICTOR COY

Admitted to the Degree of Doctor of Philosophy

David completed an Economics degree at Nottingham University (UK) in 1963 and a Masters degree in Accounting at Massey University in 1987. His doctoral thesis explored the accountability and annual reporting of the tertiary education sector in New Zealand. A delphi study was conducted to develop a public accountability index for university annual reporting. The thesis advocates a broader and more holistic form of annual reporting which emphasises public accountability over decision usefulness, service performance over financial performance and non-financial, narrative and statistical information over financial statements. David continues to teach and research in the School of Management Studies at the University of Waikato.

ROBERT EWOUT LIEFFERING

Admitted to the Degree of Doctor of Philosophy

Robert completed a Bachelor of Science and Master of Science degree in Soil Sciences at Massey University before coming to the University of Waikato in 1991 to work as an Assistant Lecturer and undertake DPhil studies in the Department of Earth Sciences. Robert studied the effects that applying strongly alkaline solutions with large monovalent cation concentrations can have on soil chemical and physical properties. He showed that adverse effects of alkalinity on the soil were different and additional to the effects on monovalent cations, and developed a conceptual model to predict and mitigate the problems that occur when contaminated waste water is irrigated onto land. Since completing his doctorate, Robert has been employed as an Environmental Quality Officer at the Marlborough District Council.

GYWNETH ANN VERKERK

Admitted to the Degree of Doctor of Philosophy

After completing a BVSc from Massey University, Gwyneth worked in veterinary practice for several years, before establishing her own practice, Newstead Veterinary Services and raising a family. Recently she joined the Dairy Research Corporation at Ruakura to undertake research on the health of dairy cows. Her concurrent doctoral studies in the Department of Biological Sciences have been on the function of the cortex of the adrenal gland in cattle and have included the development of tests for adrenal cortical function and pituitary - adrenal function and the influence of the parturition - inducing agent dexamethasone on the function of the adrenal gland. During these studies, a marked difference between cows and bulls in their adrenocortical response has been found. Gwyneth is now employed by the DRC to extend this research

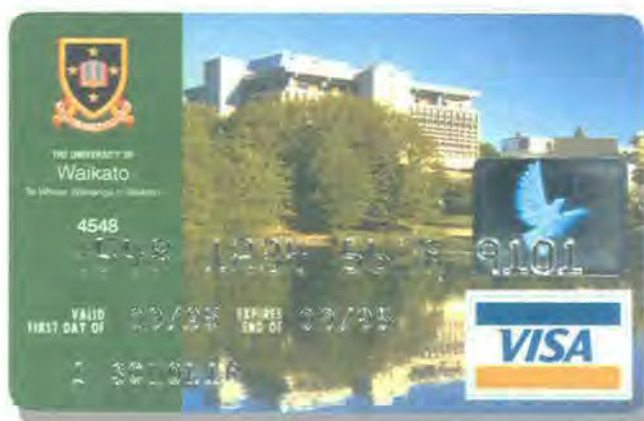
